

Occupational Ergonomics: Concepts of Moving and **Handling**

(RHAB801) 30 points

Paper overview

This paper provides a foundation in the academic and contextual setting for the moving and handling professional. It facilitates critical review and application of theory, evidence-based strategies and knowledge of moving and handling practice to healthcare and industrial sectors.

Programme study options

This paper is available from the Faculty of Health and Environmental Sciences in the rehabilitation specialisation area.

Who can study this paper?

The paper is for health professionals who will normally have completed the requirements of one of the following in a relevant field from a New Zealand tertiary institution or equivalent:

- A bachelor's degree
- Professional qualification recognised by the university as being equivalent to a bachelor's degree
- Evidence of professional experience deemed by the university to be equivalent to a bachelor's degree

Where entry qualifications do not meet the criteria for study at postgraduate level, completion of transitional studies may be required before the applicant is admitted to the programme.

What can you expect to learn?

The content of this paper is informed by current best evidence and will be constantly evolving in response to new knowledge in the field. The broad content of the programme will include the following areas:-

- Legal context of moving and handling
- Assessment of risk associated with moving and handling
- Design of the physical environment
- Evaluation and management of complex moving and handling scenarios
- Interventions to reduce risk associated with moving and handling

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How much time will I need to commit to the paper?

How much does this paper cost?
